"Right now, H.E.A.R.T.'s fleet is limited and unable to transport the many people who desire this service", says Jane Cummins, founder and executive director of the H.E.A.R.T. Program, "The H.E.A.R.T. trainees are adults, but they are unable to drive due to their disabilities. Many of them are also not able to ride the bus independently. Without H.E.A.R.T.'s transportation program, they will be unable to travel to their jobs."

The H.E.A.R.T. Program has drivers on standby ready to launch this next level of their transportation program and trainees ready to ride! All that is needed...a minivan to take them there!
